We believe that Jesus is a high priest forever for us, and that he presented himself in our name before his Father, to appease his wrath with full satisfaction by offering himself on the tree of the cross and pouring out his precious blood for the cleansing of our sins, as the prophets had predicted. He suffered—the "just for the unjust"—in both his body and his soul. He endured all this for the forgiveness of our sins.

Therefore, we rightly say with Paul that we "know nothing but Jesus and him crucified"; we consider all things as "loss for the surpassing worth of the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ." We find all comforts in his wounds and have no need to seek or invent any other means to reconcile ourselves with God than this one and only sacrifice, once made, which renders believers perfect forever.

This is also why the angel of God called him Jesus—that is, "Savior"—because he would save his people from their sins.

We receive the grace of the Gospel in the visible form of bread and wine Gluten-free bread is served for the Lord's Supper. Wine is also served; however, the outer ring of each tray contains grape juice for those who desire it for reasons of health or conscience. Please hold the elements until all have received them, so that we can partake together.


