



AUSTIN AND RACHEL KETTLE, MISSIONARIES TO BELGIUM

Half-way there, living on a prayer!

We reached 52% of our monthly support goal! We are seeing God's provision again and again and we take steps of faith day by day. When we first received our required fundraising budget from MTW, it felt like the metaphorical elephant. We knew we could only tackle it one bite at a time. Now, looking at this half-eaten elephant, the second half seems smaller than the first. Perhaps it's because God has already shown us how he is going to make this happen.

Encouraging News from MTW

We recently received word from Mission to the World that we are **exempt from Pre-Field Training** due to our experience living cross-culturally. This is a gift—it saves us time and money, and it removes the November 80% deadline for training. **However, we are still pushing toward 80% by November.** Why? Because spring will be full of major transitions—applying for visas, selling our home and cars, downsizing, preparing our girls, and countless logistics. Every percentage of support raised now allows us to focus then on **preparing our family and hearts for Belgium.**

New Partnerships in Brussels

Arriving with us in June will also be the Pierce family. They are in the photos this week! They also have three children, around the same ages as our own. The Pierces are planning to start a Reformed University Fellowship (RUF) at the local universities in Brussels (the Dutch-speaking VUB and French speaking ULB). When I (Rachel) was a graduate student in Brussels, I studied on both of those campuses, and this sort of ministry would have been a life line! We are also praying that RUF becomes a key part of our work as a church reaching the lost in Brussels. The Pierce family were in Virginia and stayed with us a few weeks ago. We, and definitely the kids, had a great time and we are looking forward to being alongside them in ministry and for our kids to have fellowship.

A big concern we share is **school enrollment** for our children. Registration in Belgium begins early and depends on residency address, which is why a June arrival is so important. Please join us in praying for:

- Smooth housing and address registration
- Open doors for school placement
- Peace for us as parents, trusting the Lord with the hearts of each child

RICHARD AND ROBYN CRANE, MISSIONARIES TO LATIN AMERICA

It is with great sadness that I write this letter to inform you of my upcoming retirement. Yes, it is more of a "sorry for my loss" than a "congratulations" moment. Robyn and I have had the privilege of being missionaries for over 48 years, all this time we have been faithfully supported financially and in prayer by you. As you, our partners, and we have been ministering together in Chile for 23 years and in Cuba for another 23, we have seen God provide and bless in so many ways. Let me go down memory lane for a minute.

Highlights of Our Partnership over the Years

In **Chile**, starting in 1979, we were very involved with the National Presbyterian Church. We started a church plant in a suburb of Vica del Mar, wrote a 50 -lesson Bible survey course for theological education by extension, and taught various courses at the "Seminario Juan Calvino," which later moved to Santiago and was called the "Evangelical Institute of Chile." In Santiago, I was very involved in counseling, and we started a Christian counseling center. We co-labored with our fellow missionaries Richard and Angelica Ramsay in a church plant called "Gracia y Paz" and helped start a few other congregations in the city.

In 1991, we participated with Chilean professionals in the formation of PEPP, a two-year pastoral psychology training program for church leaders. Over 700 leaders from 15 different denominations graduated over the next few years. With these professionals, we also wrote a book on pastoral psychology, which has served as a tool for Hispanics in many countries.

At that time, with Robyn, we formed EMEP (Presbyterian Marriage Encounter) as an outreach of the Cristo Rey Church. This was an intense and exciting evangelistic and discipleship ministry that continued for 7 years.

From 1997 to 2002, we became deeply involved in

the Cristo Rey Church, where I became a pastor for two years. You, our partners, helped us raise funds for the construction of the church building in an important sector of Santiago.

In 2003, we moved to Miami and joined the Latin American Faculty for Theological Education (FLET) under a mission organization called LOGOI. With FLET, we developed and taught many courses in Miami and started traveling to various Latin American countries, including Cuba, teaching courses in pastoral theology and counseling.

Over the years, our ministry in **Cuba** intensified more and more, taking more trips each year to teach intensive courses until we developed a counseling program called CENACE (Center for Gospel Centered Counseling). We added several courses and adapted what we developed in the PEPP in Chile. So far, some 200 students from about a dozen cities have graduated in Cuba, and now the graduates are teaching it in their churches. On this past trip with Garry Chambers, we heard many testimonies of the impact this program has had on their personal lives and the ministry in their churches.

In the past few years, we have also had the privilege of conducting conferences to a network of over a hundred churches and ministry leaders of different denominations in Havana. Teaching and preaching the gospel and grace to so many who have centered only on the law has been liberating and exciting.

In Havana, we have also conducted spiritual retreats and have come alongside a new church plant called Puente. With your generous donations, they were able to buy a building, and in a very short time, they are having an impact on the artist community and in mercy outreach to their neighborhood.

You, our partners, have also been very generous in showing mercy for their needs over all these years of involvement in Cuba. As a result, we have helped them buy farms, church properties, fix and expand their church buildings, buy musical instruments for

worship, and aid them very significantly in hurricane relief. During COVID, you were generous in helping dozens of pastors with their salaries since they were not allowed to meet and receive church offerings. In the chronic economic crisis of the past few years, your gifts have supplied an abundance of medicine, food, clothes, power generators, and power stations. What is most remarkable to Robyn and me is the humility and joyful trust in God that our brothers and sisters have in the midst of this crisis. They praise God when we arrive with this aid, and they praise God when they don't get it. Their dependence is upon God; it is not a dependence on us nor the aid they receive.

It has been an honor and a privilege to be God's instrument, and yours, in our mission to Chile and to Cuba.

Continued Support

So what happens now? Without another point person from MTW for Cuba do we just leave them high and dry? These are the steps that we would like to take:

- 1. I am retiring from MTW on the last day of December and will no longer get a salary, yet I am allowed to continue as a volunteer.
- As volunteers, we will continue to stay in contact with our brothers and sisters in Cuba, mentoring, counseling, encouraging, and taking some trips there.
- 3. What can you do?
 - Our partnership may end upon my retirement, yet I would challenge you to not retire your partnership with our brothers and sisters in Cuba. They continue to need your support in prayer and financial aid through various projects as they become approved by MTW. As a volunteer, I can continue writing prayer letters to keep you informed about the church in Cuba and provide opportunities to support them.
 - Robyn and I need your financial help right now. Our personal support account is in deficit, and it needs to be healthy before you stop your support. So I'm appealing to you to

give over and above your regular giving from now to the end of the year, and to consider giving to our support account during the month of January and stop after that. Why? Even though our salary will remain intact through December, the money that remains in our support account is what we will be able to draw upon for our future trips to Cuba as volunteers.

Prayer and Praise

- Praise God for His faithfulness and blessing in our partnered ministry over the years, both in Chile and in Cuba.
- Praise God for the 900 + counselors trained, for their ministry in their local churches, and for the continued training by them. Pray that God will use them to bring about Gospel direction and healing to many families in their churches and community.
- Praise God for the team of churches and individuals who have partnered with us in this ministry. What has been described above, and so much more, could not have been done without God working through you.
- 4. Pray for generosity of our donors to finish the year with sufficient funds in our support account, allowing us to continue traveling to Cuba once I become a volunteer.
- 5. Pray that we daily find our strength in the power and grace of the Gospel.

May the Lord bless you and keep you!
