A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

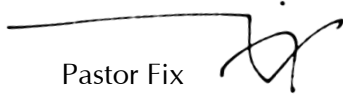
*We are so glad you

We believe in families worshipping together so we welcome children of all ages to be with us during the whole worship service.

Nursery is offered for children ages 5 months to 5 years during the morning worship service and morning discipleship.

Discipleship is offered for all ages immediately after the morning worship service. We have classes for children age 4 through 12th grade in the classrooms. For adults we have either a class or sermon discussion in the big meeting room.

Evening Worship meets every Sunday at 6:00 PM, except on the first Sunday, when we have Hymn Sing, which is also at 6:00 PM.

SERMON SERIES: THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO THE LAW

SERMON TITLE: *"Spiritual Fidelity and Boundaries"*

SERMON TEXT: *Deuteronomy 23:1–14*

FRIDAY

Matthew 5:27–30; 15:10–20; 1 Peter 1:13–2:12

How does Jesus reveal what truly defiles us, and how does that affect our ability to worship God? How do we pursue heart-level holiness?

SATURDAY

Acts 8:26–40; Hebrews 10:19–25

How does the good news of Jesus Christ fulfill and transform these laws from Deuteronomy? What hope does this give for those once excluded?
